

Instructions for Video Submissions

SCT recommends that you submit your video audition via Youtube, and we have included instructions below on how to do so. However, if you prefer another video sharing website or to submit your video as a file, we will also accept submissions in those forms!

- Make sure your submission includes your audition video, your completed audition form, and either a headshot or any photo of you from around the shoulders up.
- Your video should be titled with your first and last name and either Performance Lab Musical or Performance Lab General (ex. Abby Sledge – Performance Lab Musical)
- Please include the character's name, the title of the show and the author of the show for your monologue (and your song, for a Musical Theatre audition), either in the video description or in your email.
- Send your video, audition form, and picture to dramaschool@sct.org, and title the email "Audition – Student First and Last Name" (ex. Audition – Johamy Morales)

Tips and Tricks

- If possible, we recommend that your student's whole body be visible in frame.
- Please film in a quiet area to ensure that the video has a good quality of sound.
- For students submitting a musical audition, your song section can be done a cappella or with a musical backing track, as long as we can clearly hear your voice.

To Submit via Youtube from Web:

- Visit www.youtube.com
- Create an account or sign in
- In the top right-hand corner of the window, click the camera with a plus icon
- Choose "Upload video"
- Upload your video to Youtube

You should see a window with 3 sections: 1. Details 2. Video Elements 3. Visibility

Details section

- Title video with First & Last name, a dash, and Performance Lab Musical or General
 - Ex: Abby Sledge – Performance Lab General
 - Ex: Johamy Morales – Performance Lab Musical
- In the description, please include the character's name, the title of the show, and author(s) of the show; if you are listing multiple pieces for a Musical Theatre audition, please separate them with a semicolon
 - Example for General: Trinculo from *The Tempest* by William Shakespeare
 - Example for Musical: Trinculo from *The Tempest* by William Shakespeare; Hans from *Frozen* by Kristan Anderson Lopez
- Under "Audience" click "Yes" for the question, "Is this made for kids?"
- Scroll down to "License and distribution" & check "Allow embedding"
- Scroll further down to "Comments and ratings", and under "Comment visibility", choose "Disable comments" (Recommended by SCT but not required)
- Click "Next" in the bottom right hand of the window

Video Elements section

- Click "Next" to enter the next section

Visibility section

- Under "Save or publish" choose "Private" –
 - *This is a very important step. SCT Drama School wants to protect our students' privacy, so please make this video private to ensure that the only people viewing your video are who you share the code with*
- Click "Save" where the "Next" button used to be

Your video has been uploaded – you are almost done!

- You should see a thumbnail of your video.
- Hover your mouse over the video, and some icons should appear
- Click the three vertical buttons
- Click "Get sharable link" – this link should be copied to your clipboard
- Paste link in the email with your audition form
 - SCT Drama School recommends checking the link by pasting it in your browser. If it takes you to the video, you've successfully uploaded the video and copied the link
- **Send, along with your completed audition form and photo, to DramaSchool@sct.org with the title "Audition – Student First & Last Name"**

Instructions for Youtube Submission from iPhone App

- Click the camera at the top of the screen
- Choose your video or record your video – do not click "Go live"
- Trim the video if you so choose
- Choose "NEXT" at top right hand side of the screen

"Add details" section

- Title video with First & Last name, a dash, and Performance Lab Musical or General
 - Ex: Abby Sledge – Performance Lab General

- In the description, please include the character's name, the title of the show, and author(s) of the show; if you are listing multiple pieces for a Musical Theatre audition, please separate them with a semicolon

- Under "Privacy" tap "Public" and change to "Private – Only you can view"
 - *This is a very important step. SCT Drama School wants to protect our students' privacy, so please make this video private to ensure that the only people viewing your video are who you share the code with*
- Choose "Upload" at top-right hand of screen
- This should take you to a list of your uploaded videos
- Click the 3 dots on the right-hand side of your video, and click "Share"
 - Youtube may ask you to publish the video. Click "Yes"
- **Copy the link and send, along with your completed audition form and photo, to DramaSchool@sct.org with the title "Audition – Student First & Last Name"**
