Seattle Children's Theatre brings *Balloonacy*, a wordless, whimsical comedy to the stage

(Seattle, Wash.) Seattle Children's Theatre (SCT) is ushering in spring with the playful, feel-good *Balloonacy*, created by Barry Kornhauser and directed by SCT Artistic Associate, Rita Giomi. This highly musical, physical, and entirely wordless comedy hailed as "short, simple, silly, and superb" (Twin Cities Pioneer Press), runs from March 14–May 5, 2019.

Balloonacy is the story of the unexpected friendship between a lonely man and a mischievous red balloon who floats in to the man's apartment, shaking up his mundane routine. It is the old man's birthday, and the balloon is his only guest. The rascal balloon teases, hides, and plays until the exasperated old man attempts to throw the balloon out of his apartment. Throughout the course of their silent and humorous interactions, the old man discovers he has been missing something very important in his life: friendship and play.

With funding from the Bush Foundation for early childhood development, playwright Barry Kornhauser wrote *Balloonacy* specifically for children ages six and under, the first script of its kind at Children's Theatre Center in Minneapolis. The production is fully accessible to children who may be challenged with language barriers, such as immigrant or refugee young people with limited knowledge of English, or those who may be hearing impaired.

"*Balloonacy* is special in its complete inclusiveness," remarked Giomi. "Because of the wordless nature of the story and playful physical comedy, it is a story that children of all developmental levels are delighted by. Friendship is a universal language."

Balloonacy marks the final show that Rita Giomi will direct for SCT as she enters retirement at the close of the 2018-2019 season. Her work has been seen on SCT stages for the last 38 years, and leaves a tremendous legacy on its theatre community.
